Install + Set Up (User Manual)

Click on **System > Configuration > Sales Emails** to get started. Individually configure every email type you see below with the pdf documents you want to automatically attach.

We indicate which features are available on which version of Fooman Email Attachments in the following way: (v1.0.0+).

Standard Magento Settings

The first six settings are standard Magento settings - configure these as per normal.

Be sure to enable automatic sales emails.

Attach Order/Invoice/Shipment/Credit Memo as Pdf (v0.5.0+)

When set to “Yes”, your order/invoice/shipment/credit memo pdf document will be automatically attached to the order/invoice/shipment/credit memo email.

Attach Terms and Conditions (v0.5.0+)

When set to “Yes”, your Terms and Conditions html and text files (from Sales > Terms and Conditions) will be automatically attached to the email.

If you also use Fooman Pdf Customiser, the Terms and Conditions will be installed as a pdf document instead.

Attach Pdf File (v0.9.0+)

Choose to upload any pdf document to automatically attach to the email – for example, your return policy, a coupon or voucher, your latest newsletter.

How to print an Order Confirmation PDF

You can print an Order Confirmation PDF from the Order Overview Page (v0.8.3+) and an individual Order Page.

An Order Confirmation document contains the same information as an invoice, with the title “Order Confirmation”.

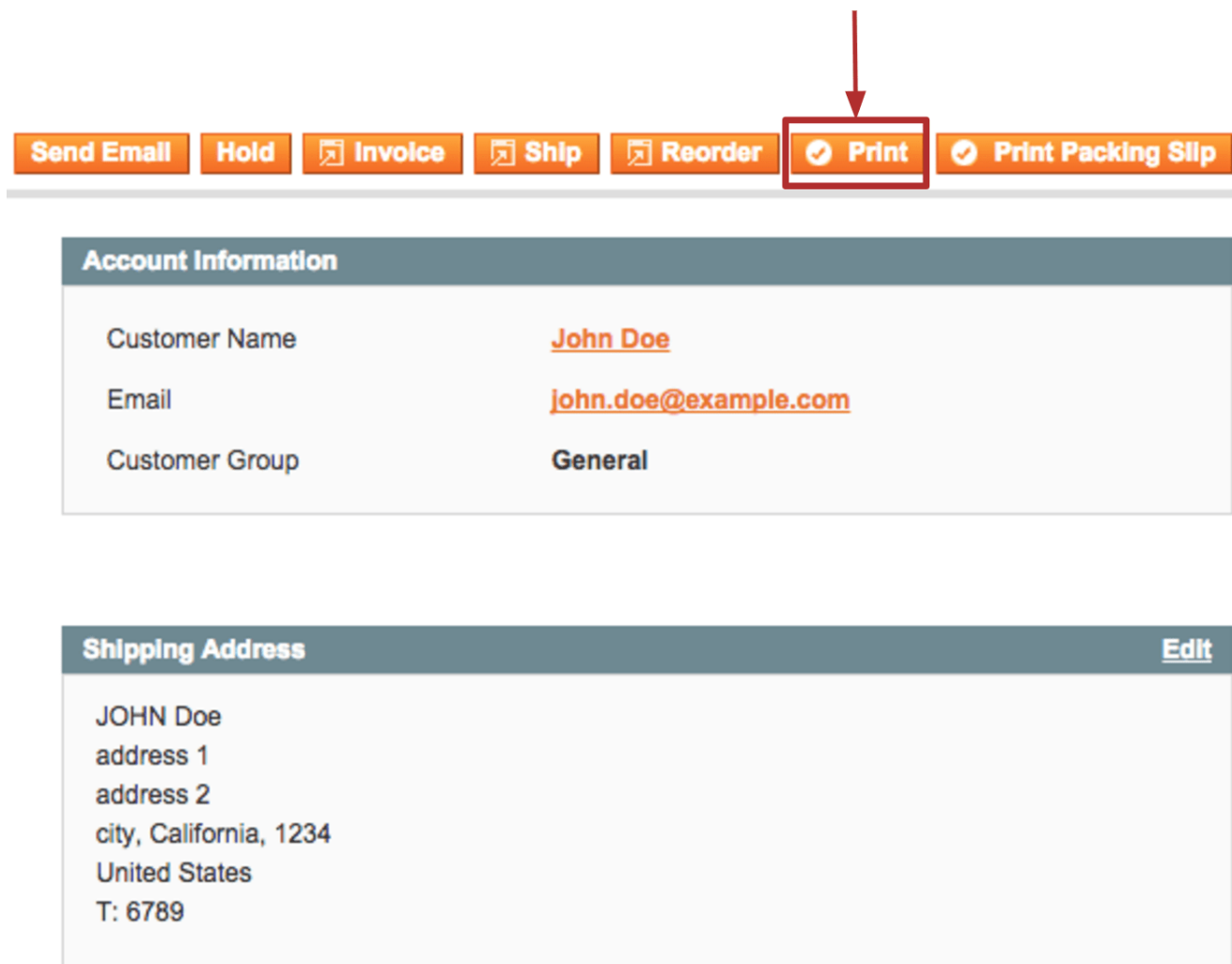
1. Order Overview Page

Select the order(s) that you want to generate an Order Confirmation pdf document for, choose “Print Orders” from the Actions dropdown list, and click “Submit”.

If you select multiple orders, the Order Confirmation for all selected orders will be displayed in the same pdf document.

How to customise the new Order Confirmation PDF

The order pdf is generated here:

`/app/code/community/Fooman/EmailAttachments/Model/Order/Pdf/Order.php`.

The pdf closely matches the default Magento invoice pdf. Feel free to adjust this code to your needs.

For an easier option you might want to check out [Fooman Pdf Customiser](#), which adds 65+ easy custom options via the Magento backend.

Example: Removing the tax column from the Order PDF

Copy `app/code/core/Mage/Sales/Model/Order/Pdf/Items/Invoice/Default.php`

to `app/code/local/Mage/Sales/Model/Order/Pdf/Items/Invoice/Default.php`

and remove/comment out this code

```
$lines[0][] = array( 'text' => $order->formatPriceTxt($item->getTaxAmount()), 'feed' => 495, 'font' => 'bold', 'align' => 'right' );
```

In addition, please edit the local copy
of `app/code/community/Fooman/EmailAttachments/Model/Order/Pdf/Order.php`
`_printTableHead()`

and comment out these lines:

```
return parent::_drawHeader($page); $page->drawText(Mage::helper('sales')->__('Tax'), 480, $this->y, 'UTF-8')
```

How to hook into the email sending process with events

If you write your own extensions, from v0.7.1+ you can hook into the email sending process with the following events:

- `fooman_emailattachments_before_send_order`
- `fooman_emailattachments_before_send_invoice`
- `fooman_emailattachments_before_send_shipment`
- `fooman_emailattachments_before_send_creditmemo`

The dispatch call looks like this:

```
Mage::dispatchEvent('fooman_emailattachments_before_send_order',  
  
    array(  
  
        'update'=> false,  
  
        'template' => $mailTemplate,  
  
        'object' => $this  
    )  
);
```
